La Finca in Costa Rica is the international ministry base. There is a house for the caretakers and a small church building that was long ago outgrown and is now used for meetings and

special activities. The large gym is home to the children's feeding center and is used for many youth and outreach events and Sunday church services. Also, there is a large outdoor space that includes a popular soccer field. That is where a massive piece of plastic covered with soap and water was the main event at the recent sixth-grade camp. After eight hours of non-stop water games, they were begging for more. We are thankful for La Finca, a safe place where kids can be kids.



The winning team received the coveted church medal and a bag of candy that included Snickers. Many of these young people had never eaten a Snickers and so it was fun to watch them slowly, small bite by tiny bite, eat one, and then save the other two. A top goal is to make these youth feel super special in a place where they are largely ignored.



Mark got to share the gospel with the sixth graders, where twelve boldly raised their hands to indicate that they had just prayed to receive Jesus as Lord and Savior. A week later, these twelve were invited to La Finca to hear about discipleship and how to begin their walk with the Lord. This "meeting" took place around

a campfire where they all had their first-ever s'mores. Pedro, pictured here, was one of the few who did not burn his marshmallows to a charred crisp.
